Department Presentation	Dawn Johnson, Staff Development: (see notes) Johnson was presented some questions about the CNA and LVN programs. There will be a CNA class beginning in August. This will reduce cost by reducing registry.	Yes
	Daryl Marzan, Physical Therapy: Power point (see attached) Personnel has been an issue with the income/expense of the department. Cost of travelers has impacted budget. Revenue in Acute, Swing, SNF does not reflect on PT man hour revenue. PT spends 2-3 hours per week for fall assessments — which we are not paid for. Need to document time which could help in cost recoup eventually. Hopefully will have 3 permanent employees by the end of the year. Adam Dendauw, Cardiac Rehab: Not a large revenue builder, the department hopes to utilize and help with PRIME project. They now have a contract with Partnership for cardiac rehab services. Dr. Dahle is getting certified for Cardiac Stress test program. This should be a good revenue generating service. The department received an \$11,500 grant to replace equipment from Sierra Health Foundation. Cardiac Maintenance numbers are up. Many referrals have come over after PT treatment is over.

Title 22 regulations state we must provide a director of staff development for 32 hours per week due to our bed capacity. CNA's must complete 48 hours of in-service every 2 years. We provide over 90 hours of in-service opportunities each year. There are two mandatory in-services that all CNA's must complete each year, those are dementia specific training and elder and dependent adult abuse reporting. By keeping our CNA's in compliance, we reduce the cost of registry. My goal is to reduce the use of paper as much as possible and utilize our new equipment in the board rooms.

Where We Have Lost Money Fluctuating consistency of PTs in clinic over the last year Fall assessments Certain contracted insurances: Ie. Sierra Pacific; will only allow \$75 per visit billed Insurance will cover 80% of that Patient only legally able to pay the difference







Goal is to use both of these to increase exposure to cardiac rehab and increased referrals as we have over the last Fiscal year as revenue is up roughly 20%, (68K over 55K) it's a start, but we are going to work on bringing that up.

Partnership Contract: Recently completed a contract with Partnership so that they will approve cardiac rehab for their patients, currently 3 in the process of joining the program.

Cardiac Stress Testing: Dr Dahle, will be attending the conference July 23rd and 24th

These tests are relatively short, 30 minutes and can be billed out at about \$1,000; goal is to perform on Tuesdays to begin with and stack these throughout the day to add revenue to cardiac.

Prime: Cardiac Rehab is poised to help us achieve our metrics required for the Million Hearts initiative which is part of the Prime Project, can bring in \$750,000/year for 5 years.

- Blood pressure metrics
- Smoking cessation Metrics
- Hope to increase maintenance PT

Approved for grant for \$11,500 replace two pieces of old equipment and help accommodate the new influx of Prime patients.
